

About this Course

School buses are primarily used to transport students to and from schools, but they also used for transporting students to and from co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

Each day, operators are responsible for ensuring the bus is in safe operating condition by conducting a daily trip inspection before the bus is used. By completing the inspection, an operator can bring to their supervisor's attention any defects that could lead to a breakdown or potential crash resulting in injuries.

In this training module, we'll show you all of the steps for conducting this procedure. The average trainee will require approximately 40 minutes to complete both the course and quiz.

Course Outline

The daily trip inspection can be divided into three basic parts:

1. Under the hood and engine compartment check.
2. Engine start-up and the interior inspection
 - check gauges with engine running
 - switches and interior lights check
 - a general inspection of the interior.
3. The walk-around and exterior inspection
 - general inspection of the exterior
 - all lights and signals check.

Additionally, this course demonstrates a post-trip inspection usually done at the end of the day or trip.
